

ADJECTIVES!

Match the Gender/# of the Noun (Masc./Fem.) + Come after the Noun

- Generally, adjectives ending in "o" are masculine so the feminine form is made by replacing the "o" with an "a".

****Notice the change in "word order" between Spanish and English**

los niños altos	<i>the tall boys</i>	las niñas altas	<i>the tall girls</i>

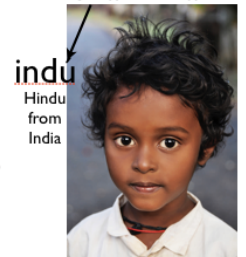
